



# PLAN FOR YOUR PLAN B

- 3. This starts with our mental health. Tackle one goal at a time and keep your wellbeing and happiness at the forefront of each goal you're working on.

Be prepared with your Plan A and brace for your Plan B – after all, there's nothing like the confidence that comes from being prepared.
